
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

Chart 1. Job openings as a percent of employment for the United States and Alaska, seasonally adjusted




...and labor force participation is above pre-pandemic




But older workers participate at a lower rate...



...and our population is aging




The only age brackets that are growing are the retiring or retired




Our prime working age population is shrinking

 This graph compares the number of people in each age group to itself 12 years ago




And smaller than we would have expected based on who lived here 12 years ago




 This graph compares every age today to their own cohort 12 years ago

Who is left?

- 18% of people aged 25-54 are not in the labor force and do not want a job (parenting/school/disabled/retired)
- 2% of people aged 25-54 are not in the labor force and want a job
 - 1.2% did not search for work in the last year
 - 0.24% were not available to work now
 - 0.56% are marginally attached to the labor force

Conclusions

- Alaska faces challenges in attracting people to the state
 - And the existing labor force is aging
- Where will workers for new jobs come from? What draws young people to Alaska?

- The Lower 48 economy is stronger
- Our climate and natural amenities have not changed dramatically
- Investment in quality of life and state institutions?
