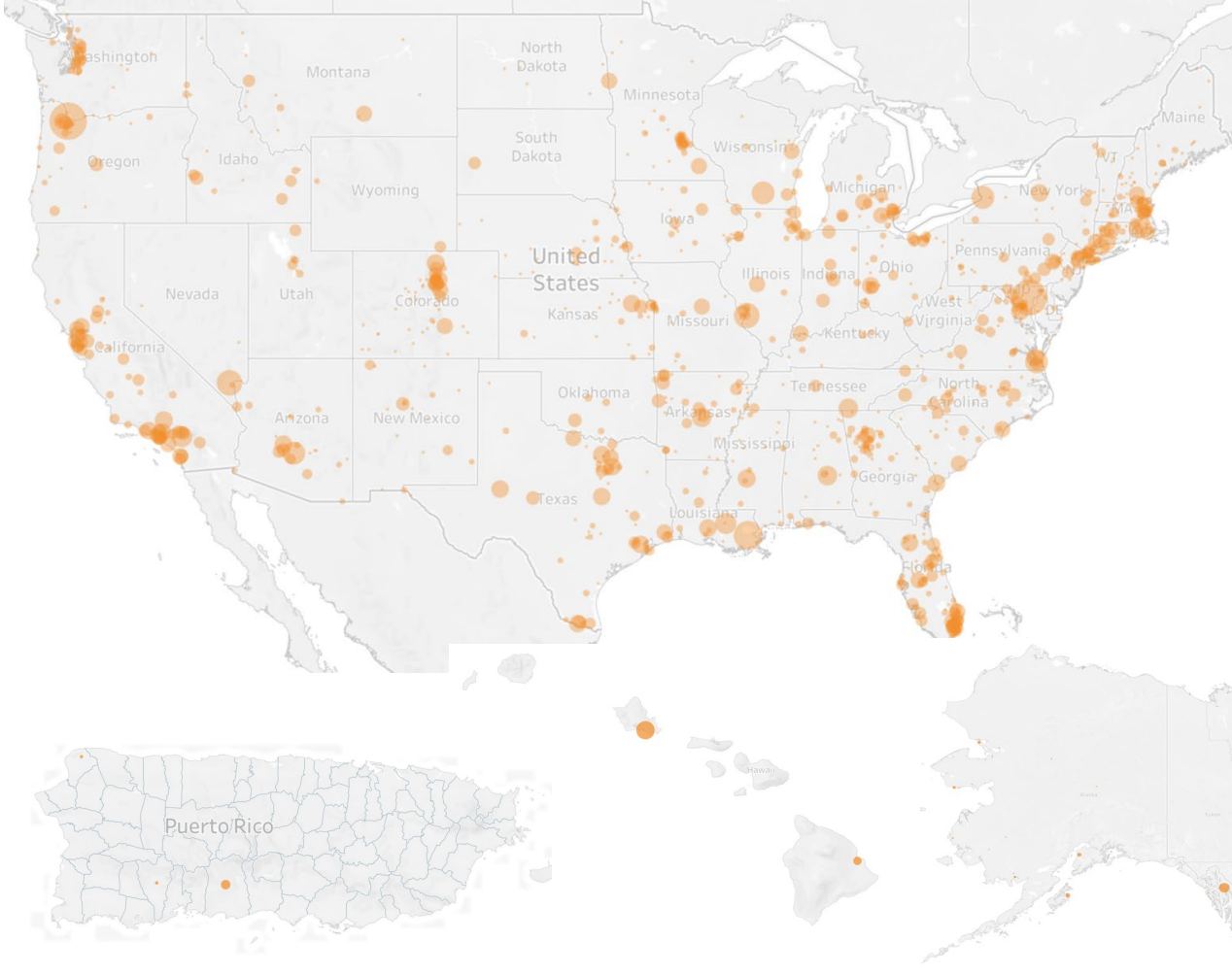

## Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling

2023

Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling (SWIFR) grants are a new program created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) to improve recycling and other post-consumer materials management, implement circular economy strategies, and improve local waste management systems. The BIL provides \$275 million for Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling grants to support Building a Better America, allocated as \$55 million per year from FY2022 to FY2026.

## Charging and Fueling Infrastructure

2023

The CFI program was created as part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and provides \$2.5 billion over 5 years for electric vehicle charging and alternative fuel infrastructure in communities and important transit corridors, with a focus on underserved and disadvantaged communities. The FY2023 funding round provided \$622.57 million in grant funding to 47 applicants.

2022 & 2023

The second round of RAISE grants awarded more than \$2.2 billion from the RAISE discretionary grant program to 162 different infrastructure projects across the country.

## Reconnecting Communities

2022

The first round of the Reconnecting Communities Pilot Grant Program awarded \$185 million to 45 communities (49 Planning Grants and 6 Capital Construction Grants) to reconnect communities that are cut off from opportunity and burdened by past transportation infrastructure decisions.

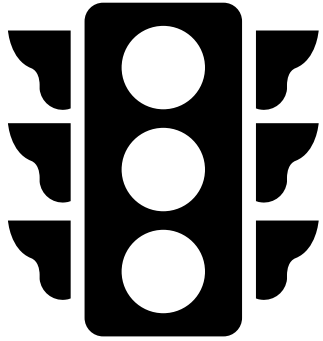

# Safe Streets and Roads for All

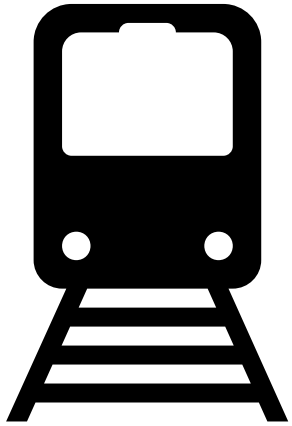


These grants provide funding to **prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries.**

Whether your city would like to use funding to add additional sidewalks or improve existing roadways, there are several ways to **apply this funding and implement safety measures.**

This training will also help participants consider the climate change and environmental impacts of their project.

# Combined Railroad Crossing Elimination (RCE) and Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI)

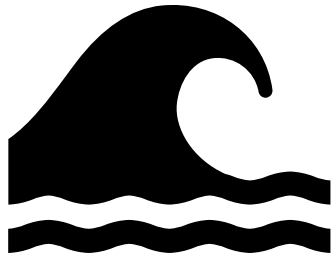


These programs focus on **highway-rail or pathway-rail grade crossing improvement projects**, promoting safety and mobility for people and goods.

Communities can use grant funding for **track relocation; improve or install protective devices, signals, or signs; improve safety; and conduct environmental audits of eligible projects**



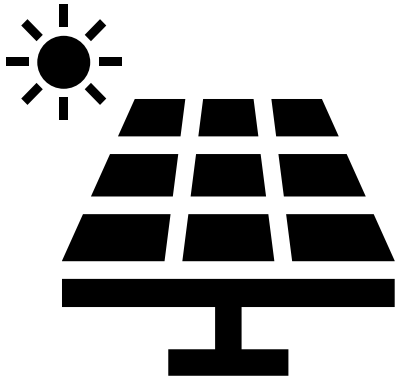
# Clean Water State Revolving Fund



This training is designed to help you seek federal low-interest loans to support **water quality infrastructure projects** in your community.

Eleven categories of eligible projects are included, including the construction, repair, and replacement of publicly owned treatment works that enhance energy efficiency, water conservation, recycling, and stormwater management.

# Developing Clean Energy Projects



Is your city looking to advance **clean energy initiatives**? This training will focus on applications for various clean energy projects and help cities navigate financing solutions, including the **Direct Pay** provision in the Inflation Reduction Act and the **Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund**, which can help turn sustainability goals into actionable projects.

# Grant Management and Implementation



If your city has won federal infrastructure grant funding but has faced **challenges navigating the complexities of infrastructure management**, this training is for you.

Cities without extensive federal grant experience often face a steep learning curve.
